From there, she qualified as an English teacher and started her teaching career at Rhyddings High School in Oswaldtwistle in 2003. In 2010 she moved to Witton Park High School as the curriculum lead for English, before being made assistant head in 2013.

In 2014 Mrs Hussain moved to BCHS as deputy head. Her first challenge was to overhaul the English department, which she did with great success. She then became associate headteacher in 2018 and headteacher in 2020, when she had to lead the school through an incredibly challenging time because of Covid-19. The rest is history, she has spent her remaining time transforming the school into the success it is today.

STUDENTS BENEFIT FROM MENTORING

15 students in years 10 and 11 have been taking part in a long-term mentoring project with IMO, a charity based in Blackburn. The students meet with their mentor, Safa Rehman for 30 minutes - 1 hour each week. Safa helps the students to discover more about themselves and what they would like to do when they leave school. Safa also uses techniques that allow the students to be self-reflective and build resilience towards learning.

The aim of the project is to ensure that more South Asian young people have a stable future career path and become more successful over time. Our students greatly appreciate the mentoring and look forward to seeing Safa each week, having built a positive relationship with her over time. We look forward to the project being extended over the coming years.
